Third Grade Summer Learning

1. Summer Reading

- Read Flora & Ulvsses
- Complete **one** of the book report options below, be ready to present to the class, and discuss the book.
 - Mobile Book Report-Students will assemble a mobile based on a favorite book. The only materials needed are string, index cards, and a hanger. First, they will take some notecards, and write information about their book on each one. The information needs to include: Story elements (setting, characters, problem, solution), Facts and opinions, Main idea, Brief summary,

 Characters/descriptions, Sketches of significant or favorite scenes.
 - Characters/descriptions, Sketches of significant or favorite scenes
 - Book Report Movie Poster- Students will create a promotional movie poster that would entice other students to read their book or to watch the movie version of their book. Get creative!
 - Stop-Motion-Animation Book Report-Students will create a short stop-motion-animation movie that recreates their favorite chapter or summary of the book. E-mail the completed movie to sking@newhopememphis.org

Oliorama Book Report-You will need to create a scene of a main event from *Flora & Ulysses*. You can use a shoe box, a cereal box on its side to construct your scene. 1. The inside and the outside of the box should be lined with colored construction paper or painted. 2. Be creative. Look around your home and outside. You can use pebbles, twigs, popsicle sticks, old jewelry, cotton balls, tooth picks, magazine cut outs, play dough, hand drawn cut outs, tinfoil, tissue paper, pipe cleaners, etc. to add detail to your diorama. 3. Make sure your name is on your diorama!
